NO TIMETABLE CLASHES WILL BE NEGOTIATED, IT WOULD BE THE STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO MAINTAIN THEIR PARTICIPATION IN THE COURSE SELECTED.

DEPARTMENT OF JOURNALISM

Master courses are open to International students in the first semester. No courses are offered in the second semester.

Honours courses are not open to international students.

DEPARTMENT OF DRAMA

Course outlines for home university theatre modules are required with application.

Theatre Skills and Theatre Arts are practical modules open in the first semester only; departmental approval is required.

DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WORK

Year modules open in first semester only, with departmental approval only.

DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY AND SOCIAL ANTHROPOLOGY

Sociology 354 (Community Development) is not open to international students.

DEPARTMENT OF POLITICAL SCIENCE

Students who apply for postgraduate courses should have a minimum of 6 semesters prior knowledge in Political Science or International Relations and a minimum average of 65%

DEPARTMENT OF VISUAL ARTS

Students cannot combine and take courses from different year levels in respective departments. Only visual art/design students are given preference. The courses from the Department of Visual Arts cannot be combined with other Arts and Social Sciences courses, because of the specific timetable.

DEPARTMENT OF INDUSTRIAL PSYCHOLOGY

Students may only apply for the honours modules (Postgraduate Level I). Check with the Global Education Centre on the available modules for each semester.

The masters courses are based on a strict selection process for local students only and might not be offered every year.

DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS

All students must apply for courses related to their degree level at their home university.

Students in their first year of their masters degree may apply for honours modules. However, it is recommended to combine modules at honours and masters level. Students must confirm if they can transfer the credits for Honours Level modules.

- No contacts with lecturers whatsoever before students are registered for a course and have been given the contact details of the relevant lecturer/s.

Approval of course modules depend on complying with the requirements as listed in the yearbook and if the student has enough background in the respective fields/courses.

For 3rd and 4th year course modules students must have at least 2 years of Engineering background and meet the specific requirements per module.

DEPARTMENT OF CIVIL ENGINEERING

Postgraduate courses are mainly block courses and does not necessarily line up with the semester dates; the schedule and availability of courses are subject to change.

UNDERGRADUATE COURSES:

- Students can only choose up to a maximum of 4 courses (may apply for more to ensure student has enough to choose from in case of course rejections by the academic department).
- Students need to read course summaries in yearbook, and ensure they meet the pre-requisites/co-requisites for courses they wish to apply for.
- Pre- and co-requisite courses need to be clearly identified in academic transcripts.
- Students need to provide course summaries (not entire course outlines) for the said courses they are applying for.

Here is an example of a course summary that needs to be provided by interested student:
