Erasmus+ funds¹ are available for SU PhD students to complete a short-term study mobility supporting their full attendance in an eligible Intensive Graduate Activity (PhD Academy, Graduate Seminar, Summer School) at VIU.

Students not eligible for Erasmus+ funding in this project may still apply to the Academic Program of their choice.

Through the Intensive Graduate Activities (PhD Academy, Graduate Seminar, Summer School) at VIU, students and scholars develop a forward-looking vision, experiment with interdisciplinary approaches, collaborate with peers from all over the world, tackle transversal topics, and undertake scientific challenges in innovative ways.

In order to apply for an Erasmus+ funded short doctoral mobility, 2 separate applications are required:

1. To apply to the Intensive Graduate Activity via VIU:

PhD Students must apply directly to the Intensive Graduate Activity and be selected in order to be eligible for Erasmus+ funding. 2. To apply for Erasmus+ funding via SU:

- Motivation letter (1-1.5 pages, academic relevance for short-term doctoral mobility, etc.)
- Short CV

Evaluation criteria for Erasmus+ funding:

Quality of the Study Plan (compatibility of studies with selected destination/program): 30 points

Language skills: 10 points Academic Merit: 30 points Motivation letter: 30 points

Available Erasmus+ funding:

Individual Support: €70.00 per day in individual support (accommodation, meals, local travel)

Full duration of Intensive Graduate Activity (5-6 days) + 2 travel days

Travel Support: €1,500.00 (return international flights)

Top-up for students with fewer opportunities: €100.00 / mobility of 5-14 days

- Household income will be used as an indicator to identify students with fewer opportunities:
 - Financial need (R0 R350 000)
 - Missing middle (R350 001 -R600 000)
- Students with disabilities
