

STUDENT HIV EXPOSURE INCIDENT

Wash skin with water and soap or rinse mucous membranes with water.

2



Office hours: report injury directly to CHS & complete incident form.

After-hours: report injury to C1D/ Trauma/ F1 and report to CHS the following morning & complete incident form.

CHS after hours number is 076 431 0305.

At peripheral sites: report to Dr/Sr in charge.

POST-EXPOSURE PROPHYLAXIS

Take available triple therapy immediately (do not delay for blood draw or results).

Draw blood from source:
HIV (ELISA)
Hepatitis B (sAg)
Hepatitis C (IgG)

SOURCE IS
HIV NEGATIVE

STOP ARV'S

SOURCE IS
HIV POSITIVE

CONTINUE WITH
ARV'S FOR 28 DAYS

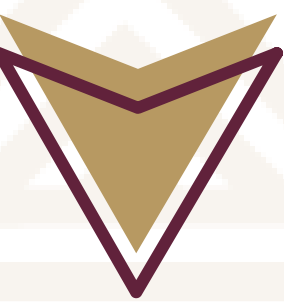
AND

Draw blood from exposed person (student)
HIV (ELISA)
Hepatitis B (sAg)
Hepatitis C (IgG)
Creatinine (if Tenofovir is part of PEP)

Enter post-exposure support system if:

- Questions on exposure risk & PEP
- Adverse reaction to PEP
- Source: On second and third line ARV's
- Exposed: HBsAb titre < 10
- Phone CHS on 021 938 9590 and ask to speak to Clinical Nurse on duty



IF EXPOSED STUDENT IS HIV POSITIVE

Stop ARV's and contact your health care practitioner / campus health services

Triple therapy
[Tenofovir/Emtracitabine plus Aluvia
or
Tenofovir/Lamivudine/Dolutegravir]
are available at all distributed platform training sites (check with SUNLOC)

Campus Health Service (Sr.)

NO contra-indications for taking first dose - ONLY contra-indication for full course is renal failure
