EXECUTIVE SUMMARY – 2015

The inpatient admissions were stable at 17 140 in 2015 (11 238 children admitted to general paediatrics and 5 902 for highly specialized paediatric care) in the Department of Paediatrics and Child Health, Stellenbosch University in Tygerberg Hospital, serving the East Metropolitan region of the greater Cape Town and the North-Eastern districts of the Western Cape. The average bed occupancy rate (BOR) was 94% for general paediatrics and 77% for highly specialized paediatric services. There was a rise in number of new paediatric oncology patients of 12% to 73 in 2015. There was a decrease in number of neonatal deaths from 24.98 in 2014 to 11.93 in 2015.

A total of 6 PhD degrees were awarded in 2015 to Proff UD Feucht, P Goussard, Drr AM Mandalakas, RS Solomons, S Thee and Prof R Van Toorn, with Proff Goussard and Van Toorn being promoted to associate professor. Dr Amy Slogrove was awarded her PhD from the University of British Columbia (UBC), Vancouver, Canada. The undergraduate pass rate increased from 96% in 2014 to 98% in 2015, while 10 MMed(Paed) students completed their Master's degree in paediatrics and 2 paediatricians qualified as subspecialists (medical oncology and neonatology). There are currently 13 enrolled PhD students. There were 89 peer reviewed articles and one book published by staff members. Nine staff members have NRF ratings with 2 as category A2.

Outstanding achievements included Prof Robert Gie receiving the Princess Chichibu Memorial TB Global Award recognising his outstanding contributions to global TB control. Prof Nulda Beyers was the first runner-up in the category: Distinguished Women Researchers at the annual South African Women in Sciences Award ceremony. Both Prof Beyers and Prof Simon Schaaf are appointed as Honorary Members of The Union. Prof Anneke Hesseling was also awarded the NRF SARChi Chair in Paediatric Tuberculosis. Proff Mark Cotton and Anneke Hesseling was appointed as distinguished professors.

Constraints experienced due to the financial savings plan with less session holders filled, especially in Paediatric Neurology and Neurodevelopment. Another constraint were a serious shortage of nursing staff, especially in critical care.
