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The equipment

- Otoscope
- Light and battery
- Speculum
- Pneumatic bulb

Examination Technique

- Positioning: patient vs examiner:
 - Comfortable seating
 - Turning head on shoulders
 - Height
 - Closeness
- Straightening canal
- Bulb



Dealing with wax


- Seldom obstructive: tympanometry
conductive h. loss
- “Teasing” it out
- Syringing: equipment
patience
first fill canal
dissolving it

The Normal Drum



Traumatic perforation of the eardrum:

- The dry perforation:
 - Avoid infection
 - Don't fiddle
 - Don't syringe
 - Don't give drops
 - High rate of healing
- The wet perforation:
 - Needs referring

Runny ear (otorrhoea)




- 3 causes: Intermittent:
Relentless:

infected perforation
cholesteatoma
TB

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
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The otitis medias:

■ Acute Otitis Media

- Ear pain
- Inflamed (red) drum




The otitis medias:

- "Otitis media with effusion"
 // "Serous Otitis Media"
 // "Middle Ear Effusion"
 // "Glue Ear"
 - No drainage
 - Intact drum
 - "Sterile" fluid behind drum
 - Variable appearance of drum
 - Mod. Cond. H. Loss
 - Tympanometry



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Ear pain with a normal drum:

- Referred ear pain:
 - Jaw joint
 - Teeth
 - Mouth and throat
 - Glands in the neck



“Funny-looking eardrums:

- Tympanosclerosis
- Retractions
- Adhesive otitis media
- Other



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
