Capstone project

The capstone project is deemed the culminating experience in HELA. The capstone can be either research-based or applications-based. See options below.

Purpose: To allow participants to demonstrate the breadth and depth of their acquired knowledge and experiences through application to a real-life setting.

- A research paper. A long-form paper that investigates a specific issue related to leadership in higher education, based on a
 comprehensive literature review and potentially original research. This may include interviews, surveys, or data analysis,
- A case analysis. Participants analyse a real-life case related to higher education leadership, outlining problems, and proposing solutions.
- Development of a strategic or operations plan for an entity. Participants create a comprehensive strategic plan for a real entity within the university, addressing key areas like budgeting, governance, staff development, operational excellence, etc.
- A community project: Participants engage with local communities to implement an initiative, for instance, a mentoring programme, improving access to resources, or initiating positive.

The capstone project will be presented at a CHEC HELA event towards achieving the CHEC Certificate of successful completion of the programme.
