Constitutional Responsibilities

According to the student constitution by constitutional responsibilities are the following:

KuKo (Arts and Culture) is a compulsory portfolio as set out in the Student Constitution under s28(5)(c), however, no further responsibilities or detail is provided within the Constitution to the specific portfolio. As a SRC manager my duties and responsibilities are provided in s36 which require me to run the KuKo Portfolio which include the organisation and administration function of the portfolio. s36(8) requires a manager to attend at minimum, one SRC Meeting per academic term. In such a meeting, I am required to report all of my activities within the said meeting.

Portfolio Overview

KuKo is required to organise at least the following events:

- Molasseser
- Palesa Festival
- SU Acapella

Furthermore, the portfolio should facilitate intentional transformation in their events.

Keeping this in mind, KuKo is not just an events planning committee. KuKo is in charge of promoting and facilitating arts and cultural projects that not only improve a student's well being but also celebrate their identities. cultures and stories of their journey at Stellenbosch University. This venue offers excellent facilities and a convenient location, making it more accessible for students and fostering a stronger sense of community. Moving the event to campus could also enhance student engagement and participation, further solidifying the Palesa Theatre Festival as a cornerstone of our cultural calendar.

This term, we also had the pleasure of assisting QueerUs with a cultural evening in town. The event was a beautiful celebration of diversity and inclusion, featuring live music and performances from talented students. It was heartening to see our community come together to support and enjoy the vibrant expressions of queer culture. The collaboration with QueerUs not only provided a platform for students to showcase their talents but also reinforced our commitment to fostering an inclusive and supportive environment on campus.

One of the challenges we faced this term was securing sponsorships for our events. Unfortunately, a potential sponsor backed out at the last minute, leaving us without external funding. Despite this setback, we managed to host our events successfully through the dedication and resourcefulness of our team. Looking ahead, we are in discussions with several hopeful sponsors for the next term, and we remain optimistic about securing the necessary support to enhance our cultural initiatives.

The Acapella scene has seen significant developments this term. There was a notable request from some of the female residences to change the prescribed song due to concerns about the lyrics. After extensive internal discussions, including input from the Acapella Coaches and Culture HC, we decided to retain the current song. We believe that it embodies a strong theme of women's empowerment, and we are committed to ensuring that our cultural expressions reflect values of inclusivity and strength.

Instead, Acapella groups can now enter themselves for a chance to compete. This new format empowers the groups to take control of their competitive journey and provides a fairer and more inclusive opportunity for all.

In preparation for future Acapella events, I recommend that the outgoing committee book the Acapella venue a year in advance. The Endler Hall, our preferred venue, is often fully booked, making it challenging to secure ideal dates for our events. Early booking would ensure that the next committee has the necessary resources and time to organize a successful competition.

Plans for Next Term

Looking ahead, we have an exciting lineup for the next term. The Acapella competition will take place from August 10 to 28, featuring several key events:

- Acascuseme: An introductory event where the Acapella groups will be introduced.
- **Tygerpella**: A mini-performance event at the Tygerberg Campus, showcasing the talent and creativity of all participating groups.
