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# Term 3 Overview

### Communications Portfolio Report

During this term, the Communications portfolio experienced a relatively restful period. However, several important issues were addressed, reflecting our ongoing commitment to student welfare and effective communication.

The primary issue raised by students was the Wilgenhof matter. The SRC welcomed the recommendations made by the independent panel tasked with investigating the matter. In response, the Council requested additional submissions from the University Community to ensure a comprehensive understanding and resolution of the issue. We are currently awaiting the outcome of these submissions, and we remain committed to fostering an inclusive and respectful campus environment.

Another significant concern was the shortage of food among students. This issue was particularly acute among NSFAS-funded students. The NSFAS Task Team, which includes several of my colleagues, worked diligently to address this problem. They made a commendable decision to provide NSFAS-funded students living in University Residences with a free lunch option for the remainder of the semester. This initiative was made possible by a generous anonymous donation to the university. The SRC is grateful for this support, which has had a positive impact on student well-being.

In addition to these primary concerns, the Communications portfolio continued to focus on enhancing transparency and engagement with the student body. Regular updates were provided through various communication channels, ensuring that students remained informed about SRC activities and decisions.

### **Visibility Portfolio**

The Visibility portfolio was exceptionally active during this term, as it is a peak period for SRC events. Our goal was to enhance the visibility of the SRC and ensure that our efforts reached all students across the university.

A significant achievement was aligning our communication platforms more closely with the university's branding standards. While progress has been made, there is still considerable work to be done to ensure consistency across all Student Leadership Structures serving on the SRC (ex-officios). This ongoing effort is crucial for maintaining a unified and professional image.

One of our main objectives this term was to increase our presence on other campuses. Recognizing that the SRC must represent all students, not just those at the Stellenbosch Campus, we curated events at Tygerberg and Military Campus. These events were designed to demonstrate our commitment to inclusivity and to show that we are an SRC for all campuses. The feedback from these engagements has been overwhelmingly positive, and we plan to continue and expand these efforts in the future.

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Furthermore, the Visibility portfolio focused on leveraging social media to increase engagement and reach. We have implemented strategies to make our online presence more interactive and informative, providing students with easy access to important information and updates.

In collaboration with the SRC President we established a new tradition by declaring the campus elections. This ensured transparency and gave students to ask questions about each structures before running for it by doing this we enhanced student participation and we hope that this will boil over into resulting a better voter turnout with SRC elections

In summary, this term has been productive for both the Communications and Visibility portfolios. We have addressed key student concerns, enhanced our communication strategies, and increased our visibility across all campuses. Moving forward, we will continue to build on these achievements, striving to serve the student body with dedication and transparency.
