Constitutional Responsibilities

According to the student constitution the SRC Innovation Officer has the following

constitutional responsibilities: The Innovation portfolio thus far has no constitutionally

prescribed responsibilities. However, I am obliged to comply with the duties allocated to

me by the general SRC which are: As the portfolio officer for Innovation:

a) Supporting student entrepreneurship

b) Facilitating innovation in SRC projects

c) Liaising with SU LaunchLab/Innovus

d) Providing student input to SU structures planning entrepreneurship projects

As an elected SRC member, my constitutional responsibilities can be divided between the

duties imposed on me as an SRC member, duties directly assigned to me by the Executive

committee and my portfolio specific duties. As an SRC Member, sections 27 and 32

impose the prevalent duties. Accordingly, I must always act in the best interest of students

and actively promote their constitutionally provided rights. Section 32 further obligates me

to submit a termly report of all my activities during the academic term. Finally, according

to section 44 I must attend an SRC meeting every week during the academic term.

Portfolio Overview

1) The Innovation portfolio of the SRC focusses on actively supporting student

entrepreneurship on campus. The portfolio facilitates innovation in SRC projects. It also

liaises with SU LaunchLab/Innovus. It ensures that student input to SU structures planning
