

Animal Tuberculosis Postdoctoral Fellowship

Scope of Research: A position for a postdoctoral fellow is available in the Animal Tuberculosis Research Group, Division of Molecular Biology and Human Genetics, Department of Biomedical Sciences at the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences, Stellenbosch University. The successful candidate will participate in a range of Animal TB research projects focusing on tuberculosis in wildlife, livestock, and animal-human-environment interfaces, and will assist in the analysis, integration, and interpretation of various datasets.

Responsibilities:

- Contribute significantly to the publication of research outputs by the research group
- Perform supervision duties for post-graduate students within the research group
- Write and submit funding proposals to facilitate the sustainability of the research undertaken
- Conduct laboratory and field work as required as part of ongoing research projects

Requirements:

- PhD in a relevant area (Molecular Biology/Biodiversity and Ecology/Biology/Immunology), must have graduated within the last 5 years
- The successful candidate may not have held any prior academic or professional posts
- Strong written and oral communication skills
- Publication of scientific peer-reviewed manuscript(s) as first author
- A background in genetics and bioinformatics, with previous work on mycobacteria, would be an advantage
- Previous experience working in the BSL3, ELISAs, and field work with wildlife would beneficial

- The contract is for two years, which will be subject to the availability of funds and satisfactory academic progress (annual performance reviews will be held).
