Postdoctoral Fellowship

Scope of Research: A post-doctoral fellowship is available for a candidate maternal and child health in Occupational Therapy. The candidate should have a research track-record with competence in quantitative and qualitative research methodologies.

The Division of Occupational Therapy will host the fellow. The incumbent will have the opportunity to participate in funded research projects. The fellow will also be eligible to apply for travel funding to attend conferences.

Requirements: The fellow will be expected to conduct research, supervise under-and postgraduate research projects, produce scholarly outputs and contribute to funding applications. The duration of the fellowship is one year, renewable for a second year based on progress.

Applicants who obtained their PhD's within the past five years will be eligible. Interested candidates should apply by submitting an up-to-date curriculum vitae.
