Care for older persons: Residential Frail Care Centre, Residential self-care units, and community-based care for the elderly. Primary and secondary services are delivered to the elderly to allow them to live independently in the community as long as possible. Several services are offered:

 - o Meals on wheels: Food prepared at Azaleahof and distributed to clients at their homes, as take aways, or at Azaleahof
